Delta Theta Tau Sorority was founded on October 16, 1903, in Muncie, Indiana by five high school girls who valued fellowship, friendship, and community activism.

We are a national group of women of all ages dedicated to promoting these same principles and ideals that have been our foundation for over 110 years. We give back to our communities. We raise money and donate our time to philanthropic causes of our choice.

We are a nonsectarian, nonacademic, women's organization. Our members must be at least 18 years old and be a high school graduate or equivalent.

Our Organization

Chapter Level

Chapters are chartered by a group of 5 or more women who agree to comply with the requirements of the National By-Laws. Monthly meetings are conducted at chapter level. Chapters support needed philanthropic projects in their areas by volunteering their time and/or financial support.

Province Level

All chapters belong to one of eight Provinces across the US based on geographic location. Provinces meet annually to discuss sorority business and to support a Province project voted on by Province members.

National Level

Delta Theta Tau Sorority is governed by an elected National Council and Board of Trustees. Members gather at an annual national convention to hold elections and to honor achievements in fundraising and volunteerism. The annual disbursement to our current National Project is bestowed. The delegation also votes to support a special nominated yearly project. Since 1959 education grants have been awarded for advanced degrees in guidance and counselling at National Convention.
